

Bob Midwood 10 – 1983

GLEDHILL LEADS ROAD RUNNERS

Pete Gledhill ran outstandingly to be first Barnsley Road Runner home in the club's Bob Midwood 10, in sweltering heat on Sunday afternoon.

Gledhill took third place in a time of 56-28 behind Sheffield A.C.'s Malcolm Martin, a marathon runner who completed the course in a record time of 54-02.

Fourteen of the field of 93 were forced to withdraw after one lap of the course which began at Worsbrough Bridge Miners' Welfare Hall and covered the scenic roads around the reservoir, through Rockley and Birdwell.

Seven other Road Runners finished in the top twenty while the first local unattached runner home was R. Haigh (24th) in a time of 67-21.

Sheffield A.C. won the team award with race winner Martin, C. Nightingale (2nd) and A. Marshall (8th).

The race was Barnsley Road Runners' final contribution to the town's leisure festival. Paul Midwood is to sponsor the event again next year, when it could possibly be a charity run with medals for all finishers.
